


Robbie the Rooster walks lazily out of the henhouse.

Inside, the kids, Sally and Jake are waking up. They had a sleep over, Sally and Jake are great friends.


They put on their clothes and run downstairs. Jake's Mum is waiting for them at the breakfast table.


They eat their porridge, it's yummy and warm. The friends eat it as fast as they can. "What a healthy way to start our day" they say.

### FUN ON THE FARM







They squish and squirm around the trough, trying to get more feed.


"The calves are definitely my favourite" says Jake. Mum smiles, the calves are the safest way to teach the children about cattle.


Well done Sally for looking after the animals.





When Dad has finished spreading the slurry, Jake goes home to get ready, Mark and Lily will be arriving soon.












Nora and Flora lie happily under the beech tree in the corner of the garden. The two dogs enjoy the shade. They can see the freshly calved cow in the next field.


Sally, Jake, Mark and Lily are playing football. Mark is bigger and stronger than the others. They hear Mum shouting; "It's time for tea!"












When they got back to the house Sally, Jake, Lily and Mum were all waiting. Mark's parents were so worried, they thanked Jake's Dad over and over again.

























# CASSIE THE CALF'S TIPS TO STAY SAFE ON THE FARM



Tip 7: Children should be with an adult at all times on the farm.

Tip 8: Ponds and rivers are dangerous. Never go near the edge of a pond or river. Never walk or skate on ice covered waters.

Tip 9: Reeds and rushes can hide ponds, streams, drains and other water hazards. Don't walk in rushes and reeds.

Tip 10: Water tanks, buckets, holes and drains can be deep and dangerous. Don't go near any of these. Adults should cover water tanks/containers, open drains or holes.

Tip 11: Shout HELP! if you are in danger.



Tip 12: Always wash your hands after being on the farm or handling animals.
