Sally skips along the beach in search of colourful shells.




After a while she looks up and she can't see her mum "Oh no" she cries "where is Mum?" She is upset and goes to the lifeguard.

"Oh Mum I will" said Sally "I'm glad we had that talk on the way to the beach, I knew to go to the lifeguards where you would find me".





"I saw Mark push Jake forward and then he fell in".






Chapter Three

"Go on blow out the candles Lily"everyone roars. Whoosh whoosh Lily blows but one candle is left lighting.




"Get Jill to help me" laughs Lily. Jill is Lily's sister she is three and full of fun.

Just then she looks out the window and sees Jill splashing around in the pool on her own.


"Oh" says Lily's mum as she rushes out to get Jill.





"Come on Sally" said Jake "lets go for a swim between the red and yellow flags".








